
How to Score an Archery Target


Single Bull is most commonly used. The score ranges from zero to 5X

A 5 spot is used by archers who don't want to scratch up their arrows. Some events require an order they are shot in but we don't require that or how many arrows in each bulls eye. They can be given a zero, 3, 4, 5, 5x





Archers shoot 2 sets of unlimited arrows for a sight in. They then shoot 12 rounds of 5 arrows. The score is determined by where the shaft of the arrow is. If the shaft breaks a line the highest score is given. If an arrow bounces out it can be re shot. The white is 5 points and a X is used for tie breakers



If the arrow misses a bull it is a zero.
